Gift of George W. Baylor's Violin

The family of David Lee King has donated a historic violin associated with Hall of Fame inductee George W. Baylor, the California Gold Rush and the Texas Rangers. It is on exhibit in the New Acquisitions case in the lobby.

Baylor was born August 2, 1832, in Fort Gibson, Indian Territory. In 1845, his family moved to Texas and later, through the influence of his uncle Robert Baylor, he attended Baylor University at Independence, Texas before its move to Waco.

Gold fever took him to California in 1854. According to family letters, George could not find steady employment or strike it rich in the gold fields. Before returning to Texas, he purchased a violin which he kept until his death in 1916. The documentation on the violin is extensive and remarkably conclusive. In his journals Baylor describes its purchase, and a circa 1915 picture shows him holding the violin with its distinctive wear and imperfections visible in detail.

BBQ Cookoff Coming in June

As part of the 200th anniversary of the Texas Rangers led by Texas Ranger 2023, Inc., a Texas Ranger BBQ Cookoff will be held at the Extraco Events Center in Waco. Up to 150

entrants from across the state will compete Thursday June 1st and Friday June 2nd. The event is free for the general public to attend.

Advisory Board Chair of the Hall of Fame and Museum, Hank Whitman, planned the BBQ competition which will be organized and judged by the Lone Star BBQ Society. Competitors will match their skills against one another for prizes awarded for overall People's Choice, and Best Ribs, Chicken, and Brisket.



The Grand Champion will carry home a three-tiered, Texas-sized trophy made of native Texas woods that tells the story of the Texas Rangers in eight panels. 

Women's Leadership Symposium Recap



Barry Caver Honored at the CJCB 5-Year Anniversary


Retired Captain Barry Caver was recognized last month by Texas A&M-Commerce College of Innovation and Design because of his continued support of their Criminal
